Sometimes life and ministry can be like a roller coaster. That certainly has been the case here in Chile. As the corona virus infections began to dissipate, more and more restrictions were lifted including the restrictions on church services. While the restrictions were not completely lifted, we were allowed to begin having Sunday services again as long as we operated within certain protocols. We had to allow 20 square feet per person with a maximum of just 25 people inside regardless of the size of the building. In order to accommodate the people, we had to have multiple services. We are also broadcasting each service live although with limited technology. Also, for each person that attends, we have to take their temperature. Then we have to record their full name along with their identification number, which is the equivalent to our social security number in the US. We are required to have a separate entry way and exit and we are required to sanitize the building between each service, right down to cleaning each chair. Of course masks are required at all times and even when I am preaching, I have to wear a mask. We are also required to provide hand sanitizer to each person and we have not been able to do children's classes. Did I mention that each person has to register during the week in order to attend? Needless to say, it has been a tremendous challenge but with the help of the Chileans, everything went well with our first service back. However, things did not go altogether as we had planned. Just like in the US, Covid numbers began rising again in the country and the government made the decision to put all of Santiago back in quarantine. So, our in-person meetings were short lived and we are back to full online services. We are not sure for how long the quarantine will last but the Covid numbers continue to rise. We would greatly appreciate your prayers. Our people have been faithful all during this year of frustrations but they do need your prayers and so does our family. Pray that God would give us wisdom to know how to navigate everything happening. Pray also that our people would continue to be faithful.
